Year 5 Topics



English: During Terms 3 & 4 we will continue the text based curriculum and will be reading:

Term 3: Poetry anthologies Journey to the River Mousehole Cat



Term 4: Warhorse

Non-fiction text, we are delighted if you are able to buy these books and read them with your child at home. It will help develop their fluency in reading and understanding of the text.

Mrs Walton will be continuing with the Fresh Start Programme and will be reading the books above as part of Guided Reading.

During the 3 week cycle all learning groups will focus on comprehension, grammar punctuation, spelling and performance. In week 3 pupils will draft, revise and edit a published piece of writing.

Maths: We are following the National Numeracy Strategy which organises work into units of work. The Maths investigation focus is 'All Possibilities'. The children are in learning groups according to their needs and rate of progress. Homework is set in these groups using MyMaths.



Any work you would like to do with your child at home could involve:-

- Learning certain maths facts by heart so that the children develop the ability to recall these facts instantly.
- Playing a game with cards or dice.
- Investigating number patterns.
- Shopping and pocket money problems.
- Use'MyMaths' site pleasé see homework tasks.

IPC—Topic Term 3—The Maya

Pupils will be learning about an ancient civilisation—The Maya.

The topic will begin with a chocolate tasting session and end with an afternoon of dance as pupils interpret the music of the Maya.

Term 4—Mission to Mars

Pupils will be learning about space exploration and as well as finding out about the plants, the Sun, Moon and Stars. During this term pupils will also have a visit from the astrodome.

ICT: During this term, the children start to use software and digital devices for recording sound. Based around the theme of a Radio Station, it is designed to encourage a creative approach that includes interviewing, making adverts and using jingles. Other software is incorporated where children write scripts and design additional advertising for their Radio Station, Opportunities are included for children to present, listen, review and evaluate their own content as well as professional and commercial examples, plus those created by their peers.

R.E.: The whole school meets every day for collective worship, except for Tuesday where the pupils meet in houses. Easter leads to Easter bonnet competition and an Easter Egg competition.



Homework Tasks and Supporting your child at home:

How Parents May Help...

Help your child develop learning skills and independence by guiding them into a routine for doing homework and being organised for school. Homework time can be up to 30 minutes an evening. Please make sure your child comes to school with the necessary books, equipment and their homework diary, daily.

Help your child to learn spellings and tables and encourage them to read a variety of texts as well as reading to you and record in their reading record book when they have done so.

Many of our pupils will be sitting the Kent Test this year in September. If you would like your child to be tutored we have fliers available from independent companies in the school office. In addition, if you Google 'Kent Test Papers Online' there are examples of the types of questions in the papers.

In addition pupils will be asked to complete a Mayan Headdress for their performance of Mayan dance.
