This booklet gives a quick résumé of our teaching and learning programme this term. There are lots of exciting events happening across Terms 3 and 4.





**English:** English will be taught in learning groups following the text-based curriculum. Each learning group teacher will send homework and spellings specific to their group. During Terms 3 & 4 we will be reading:

**Term 4:** Information texts focusing on World War 1 and Titanic **Mrs Blunden and Miss Papa-Adams learning group:** Fairy tales and information books

<u>Maths</u>: We are following the National Curriculum which organises work into Strands. The children are in learning groups according to their needs and rate of progress. Homework is set in these groups.

Any work you would like to do with your child at home



1. Learning certain maths facts by heart so that the children develop the ability to recall these facts instantly.

2. Playing a game with cards or dice.

3. Investigating number patterns.

4. Shopping and pocket money problems.

5. Use 'MyMaths' site – please see homework tasks

Aims for these terms include rounding, decimals, usually all 4 operations to solve real life problems, long division, ordering fractions and numbers up to 3 decimal places, 3D shapes, using formulae and using a protractor, these will be differentiated according to the needs of the individual learning groups.

<u>SATs:</u> We are helping the children prepare for SATs through additional intervention groups in English and Maths

IPC Topics: Term 3: What A Wonderful World We will be looking at plate tectonics, climatic regions around the world, major landforms and natural extreme events.

Term 4: Being Human

We will be looking at the major systems in the body, what makes us human and how the body changes during puberty.



<u>Computing</u>: This term we will be learning through Minecraft. The children will develop their programming and coding skills as they master the use of the TURTLE in Minecraft. The TURTLE can mine, build and move, but only if you can code it.



<u>Music:</u> Lessons will be taken by Mr Langridge. Year 6 will continue to focus on keyboards, creating a sound track to a short animation.

**R.E:** The whole school meets most days for collective worship. In class we will continue to look at Sikhism and Easter.

Homework Tasks and Supporting your child at home:

The computer suite in open both at lunch time and from 3:30 pm to 5:00 pm every day for parents and children to complete homework.

Library lunchtime open days for pupils: Year 6 pupils can access the library on Thursdays and Fridays.

\*Just a reminder that English Homework is set on a Monday and a Friday evening and maths is now set using the MyMaths website every 2 weeks.

Topic work is to be carried out on a Wednesday. If no specific homework has been set then timetables, general

specific homework has been set then timetables, general research and extra reading should be undertaken. Children should be doing at least 30-35 minutes per day.
