# Year 3 Topics



English: In the 'Text-Based Curriculum' the focus for Term 5 is children's classic literature. The chosen texts are: Treasure Island and Peter Pan. The texts for Term 6 are: Crummy Mummy and Me, and Cliffhanger.

The 'Read, Write Inc.' Programme is followed by children who need extra grounding in reading and writing.

Spelling: The spelling programme called 'Read Write Inc. Spelling is followed throughout the school and the homework is linked to the units, the National Curriculum lists and to the texts.

Within the 'text-based curriculum' key skills of spelling, handwriting, writing reading, speaking and listening will be taught.

As well as home reading, it is wonderful if you can share a book with your child for about 10-15 minutes each night. This can be listening to them read, you reading to them, or looking at and discussing a picture book, or poem. Alternatively this time could be used for finding information, sharing a snippet from the paper, jokes etc.



Maths: In Terms 5 and 6 we will continue to work through the seven strands of the mathematic syllabus: number and place value, number -addition and subtraction, number- multiplication and division, number -

fractions, measurement, geometry and statistics.
MyMaths is part of the homework used to reinforce independent learning skills and problem-solving in maths. Children should be familiar with this site but, if there are problems logging on etc., the Ellis room is open from 3:15 till 5pm every night. Times tables are practised weekly using KungFu Mathster and are taught so that children can be self-motivated in their learning. In class we are using Percy Parker Times Table songs to reinforce the children's learning.




Computing: Children are developing their computing and programming skills by programming a turtle and starting to use Scratch to make a Juke Box.

Music: Music lessons are led by Mr Langridge and are based around learning the recorder.

**R.E:** The theme in R.E. for Term 5 & 6 is Judaism.

## IPC Topics

Science:





Rocks and Soils: In Term 5 the focus is on science skills being developed through the topic of 'Rocks and Soils'. Lots of practical activities, outings which include a trip to the look at the cliffs and investigations set the context for encouraging a love of science.

In Term 6 we will be focussing on 'Saving the World', an ecology-based topic centred around the Rainforest. This will incorporate science experiments with plants, as well as Geography work about the Rainforests around the world. As part of the topic we will have a cross-curricular Rainforest Day which includes a special 'Jaws and Claws' visitor

Homework Tasks and Supporting your child at home:

Library lunchtime open days for pupils: Year 3 pupils can access the library on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays.

• In Year 3 your child is expected to do the maximum of 20 minutes homework 3

♦ READING: Reading books can be handed in when they are finished. It helps if you can write 'finished' as part of your comments. As well as home reading, it is wonderful if you can share a book with your child for about 10-15 minutes. This can be listening to them

information, sharing a snippet from the paper, jokes etc.

SPELLINGS are set each week.

MATHS: The site 'MyMaths.co.uk' is subscribed to by the school. Homework is on it for Year 3 in their group. Homework tasks will be in line with what the children are learning in class.

Your child needs their login. If the login is lost, let us know and we can give out the information again.

Tables-tested weekly "Kung-fu Mathster" Tables to learn are sent home on a 'Kung-Fu' piece of paper.
