

Gods and Mortals Homework Grid

Children can choose a piece of homework they would like to focus on each week. They do not have to do ALL of the tasks, just a minimum of one per term. They can choose to record in their book, send in photos or bring the homework in to show.

Find out about the Greek alphabet and present your findings in an exciting way.

Learn a poem to recite to the class that has a Greek theme or is based on a fable/myth.

Design and make your own Labyrinth. It could be made of straws, string or wood.

Greeks have several gods, can you write a list of Greek gods. For a bonus point, can you record what they are the god of?

Greek Temples: Temples were important buildings in Greece. Research what they looked like and how they were built, then make your own model temple.

Make a Spartan helmet or design a shield.

Cook some Greek food or a meal. Write up the recipes. Can you include a photo of your creation too?

Make a collage using pictures from holiday brochures or the internet showing ancient buildings and interesting place to visit in Greece.

Find out what life was like for children in Ancient Greece. How will you present your information?

Write an advert persuading people to visit the ancient Olympic Games.

Make an A-Z of Greece. Think about presenting your work in the best way possible. What could you do on the border? You could add an illustration to each or some of the letters along with small pictures linked to your sentences.

Find out some simple Greek phrases. E.g. Hello, How are you? What's your name? etc. Can you make a poster to display them in Greek and English? If you can learn the pronunciation, can you try and teach us at school?

Myths and Monsters: The ancient Greeks made up stories called myths to help them understand the world. Their stories were tales of gods, heroes and mythical creatures. Make up your own Greek myth and present it however you wish.

Design and make your own Medusa head, write instructions for the steps you have taken to create the mask.
