Behaviour at Upton Junior School

### Team Upton's Expectations

- At Upton Junior School we have high expectations for all of our children.
- We expect all children to behave in the 'Upton Way'.
- Our positive Behaviour for Learning (B4L) is shown in how the children behave in class, in and around the school, outside at play/lunchtimes and in after-school activities.
- We also understand that children <u>are still learning</u> how to behave appropriately and how to control their emotions

- Children start each day with 5 points and they are expected to keep 5 points each day for following the Upton Way.
- Children aim to keep all 25 points each and every week
- The system isn't about children being perfect all the time; it's about them recognising inappropriate behaviour and changing it and it gives the opportunity for this to happen

#### Children who keep all their points.....

- Have a message sent home to parents every week congratulating them
- Win behaviour badges
- Have Perfect Points time at the end of every week
- Have an End of Term Behaviour Treat
- Help their class win weekly 'rockets' for excellent class behaviour
- Are proud of their achievements

- Children who keep all their points.....
- Have a message sent home to parents every week congratulating them
- Win behaviour badges (every 3 weeks)
- Have Perfect Points time at the end of every week
- Have an End of Term Behaviour Treat
- Help their class win weekly 'rockets' for excellent class behaviour
- Are proud of this

If a child is...

- Talking when they shouldn't be
- messing around
- refusing to work
- rude
- disrupting the lesson
- displaying the incorrect behaviour

They will be giving a verbal warning.

If their behaviour does not improve then a is placed on the desk in front of them.

yellow warning card

This will act as a visual reminder to the child that they need to improve their behaviour.

### **Changing Behaviour**

 If a child improves their behaviour they can then earn the yellow card back. The yellow card can then be removed from the table. They start afresh.

 If a child continues to misbehave the yellow card is changed to a red card.





### **Changing Behaviour**

- If a child has a <u>yellow card</u> on their desk at the end of the lesson they lose 1 point. The also lose 2 minutes from their 'Perfect Points time at the end of the week and their behaviour treat at the end of the term'
- If a child has a red card on their desk at the end of the lesson they lose 2 points.
- A child starts the week with 25 points. If they end the week with less than 22 points the Class Teacher will phone parents and a member of the Leadership team will speak to the child.

### Daily rewards

- Verbal praise
- Smiles
- Stickers
- Praise pads
- Cool cards. (If a child has a cool card on their table at the end of the lesson they can swap it for a house point as they leave).





### Lanyards

When a child receives their 4<sup>th</sup> behaviour badge they will be given an Upton Lanyard to put their badges on

## Silver Badges

When a child receives their 6<sup>th</sup> behaviour badge they will be given a Silver Behaviour Badge.

## Gold Badges

When a child receives their 12<sup>th</sup> behaviour badge they will be given a Gold Behaviour Badge.

#### Class rewards

#### Weekly

- The class with the most points in each year group gets a rocket to go on the relevant letter in the classroom.
  When they have filled up their 'SUPER STARS' the class will have a small reward- art afternoon, DVD, sports etc.
- One of the classes will keep our 'Behaviour Trophy' in their classroom for a week

#### Class rewards

#### Three week rewards

- The class with the most points in each year group gets a £3.00 Upton Voucher to display in their classroom.
- In terms 2, 4 and 6 each class can 'cash' in their vouchers to buy something for the class as a reward/treat.
