Communicating with Upton Staff: Fundamental to your child's success at Upton, will be a strong partnership between home and school. We have strived to open as many lines of communication as possible - to ensure all parents are fully aware and involved in their child's education.

Every member of Upton staff has a 'school email address'. For busy working parents that are unable to be at the school at the start or end of a school day, email may be the

quickest and easiest way to communicate. Staff read emails daily and will respond but, please appreciate this will usually be at the beginning, or the end of, their working day. (See staff email list given later in the newsletter)

Teachers are available at the start of the school day briefly - but please appreciate this would be for a 'quick message' as their priority at this time must be preparing for the start of the school day. The office staff will gladly take messages and share this information with teachers on your behalf.

Face to face conversations with teachers are always the preferred option if possible. Please don't feel you must wait until a 'Parent Consultation Evening'. Teachers are on the playground to dismiss their class at the end of every day. If you wish to speak with your child's teacher a quick chat at the end of the day may suffice but there may be occasions when this isn't appropriate and an appointment may be needed. Please arrange appointments via the office or contact the teacher directly.

I am very fortunate to have an experienced, very talented Leadership Team supporting my drive to ensure Upton provides a first class education for every child. Mrs McGinley is our Deputy Headteacher; Miss Arthur and Mr Walker are our Assistant Headteachers. Miss Arthur leads on Inclusion - including SEN and Mr Walker, the curriculum.

I also have four very experienced and talented 'Leaders of Learning' that oversee the education of the children in their year group team. They are:

Year 3 - Mrs Lord Year 4 - Mrs Wilson Year 5 - Mrs Walton Year 6 - Mrs Blunden

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Along with Miss Crine (School Business Manager), we make up Upton's Leadership Team and want to be readily available to parents and intend to be as visible as possible. Email may equally be your preferred form of communication to us; but we are also on the school gates at the beginning and end of every school day. Please do not leave the school grounds with a question or concern—come and speak. If we don't know the answer we will endeavour to find somebody who does!

New Staff Members: Upton, like your favourite premiership football club, want to have the strongest team at the start of a 'new season'! The transfer window has now closed and we have new 'star players' to strengthen our staff squad!

Football comparisons over - the bottom line is that the Leadership Team and Governors have made several appointments ready for the new school year; all very talented people that share our unwavering belief that we are here to provide an oustanding education for every child.



Mrs Bedingfield and Mr Skellon; two new teachers joining our staff. They will teach in Year 3 and Year 6 respectively. Both teachers have spent Term 6 with us, familiarising themselves with our

routines and high expectations.

Mr Jackson also joins us as 'Head of Computing'. Mr Jackson will lead Learning Groups in Year 5 and teach 'Computing' during the afternoon timetable.

We also welcome as 'Senior Caretaker' Mr Denny. He is currently Caretaker at Minster School and looks set to become a huge asset to Upton.

Miss Lewis (no relation!!) & Mr Brown will join us as the newest members of our support staff. They will work alongside the Year 6 & Year 4 team respectively in a September.

Welcome to you all and I am sure you will quickly become fabulous assets to Upton!

'Behaviour' Reward Point System: We start the new



school year determined to build upon the outstanding success achieved last year. An extremely impressive 60% of our pupils (300+ children) kept maximum behaviour points acros the whole year - wow!

This shows that Upton pupils not only know what 'good behaviour' is, but more importantly, they show it in their actions every day. Our start of the year assembly yesterday reinforced our high expectations on behaviour for learning and explained the 'behaviour points' to our new 'Uptonians'.

To ensure new parents are up to date and aware of the behaviour routines we use at Upton, we have 'Behaviour Information Sessions' next week. There will be two sessions (during school time and straight after school) in order to give parents and carers greater flexibility in being able to attend.

The information session will give me a chance to explain 🖁

our 'Behaviour Point System' to you and answer any questions you may have about how we reward and praise our pupils and conversely, the sanctions we apply when pupils do not behave in the 'Upton way'.

The Upton Way...'One Childhood One Chance'. The foundations of our school are based on mutual respect, we will deal with each other in the way that we would like to be treated ourselves. Our rules are simple and can be remembered - and followed - by all sections of our community: children, staff, parents and friends, and if we all stick to them then we will achieve our ultimate goal, for every child to achieve their full potential.

Our Golden Rules are as follows:

- Everyone is special and important
- Treat everyone as you would like to be treated
- · Listen when others are talking
- Try your best always
- Take care of people and properly

Core Values: Our Upton 'Core Values' are those values which we see as being at the heart of our school. They refer to those individual qualities and dispositions we believe children will find essential in the 21st century. They help to develop those qualities that will enable children to be at ease with the continually changing context of their lives.

Our 'Core Values' and Golden Rules will be revisited regularly during our assemblies and in lessons and although they aren't the only things which are important, they would be implicit and explicit to daily life at Upton.

School Uniform: It is lovely to see all the children return looking refreshed, 'sun kissed' and beautifully dressed, ready for the new school year. I have made no secret of my drive to lead Upton to 'outstanding' status and this can only be achieved with the support of the parents. Therefore I look to you to help us by ensuring the following things:

- Children will attend school as regularly as is possible
- Every child will arrive at school on time
- Every child will wear the correct uniform every day
- · Every child will complete their home learning

Hair Styles and Earrings: For parents new to Upton you will note in our 'Upton Parent's Handbook' that children with hair longer than their shoulders must wear it tied

back. This rule is for boys and girls. Children must remove earrings when swimming as there is a risk that earrings can damage our pool liner.

For PE lessons and sport, whilst we would encourage 🖠 children to not wear earrings on PE days, they can still 🖁 participate if they have earrings in - we will ask them to 🥻 cover their earrings with 'micropore tape' for their own 🐐 safety.

Our parent handbook contains up to date information 🥻 about school uniform but if you have any questions or 🤻 concerns please speak to the ladies in the Office, the classteacher or a member of the Leadership Team. I thank you for your cooperation with this.

Academic Year 2014/15: Attendance: Term dates for 🕯 the next academic year have been sent home alongside this newsletter and are available on our school website. We ask you to please consider these dates when booking 🦥 your family holidays - and in light of government 🛣 legislation, ensure holidays are not taken during term time. We thank you for your support with this.

This is just a reminder about the changes to Attendance regulations which came into force last year. For parents who apply for a leave of absence during term time, the amendments make clear that Headteachers may not grant any leave of absence during term time unless 🦥 there are exceptional circumstances.

This is for the very good reason is that a child's success 🥻 in their education will be a key determinant in their 🥻 future success in life, and in order for children to be 🐐 successful in school they need to be here! A target 🕺 therefore, for every family, should be to ensure that every child achieves at least 95% attendance across the 🧗 school year. If a child's attendance is below this figure 🦓 then it will have a serious impact on their achievement in 🖏 school and will mean that they will do much less well than they should. I have provided below an example of what percentages mean in terms of school days missed.

Attendance over one school year:

If a child had:

98% attendance = less than 4 days absent from school 95% attendance = less than 10 days absent from school 90% attendance = 4 weeks absent from school 85% attendance = $5\frac{1}{2}$ weeks absent from school 80% attendance = $7\frac{1}{2}$ weeks absent from school

Attendance over 5 school years:

If a child had:

85-90% attendance = having about half a year off school! 80% attendance = 38 weeks off school = one whole school 🕺 year missed!

We do understand as parents you are in the best position 🐐 to judge whether or not your child is well enough to

attend school. Avoidable absence for family days out, long weekend breaks and holidays are the aspects of family life that we ask you to consider before taking your child out of school. Thank you for your understanding and cooperation in this matter.

That said, if you do need to take your child out of school during the school day a 'Leave of Absence Due to Exceptional Circumstances' form will need to be completed. This is available to download from the school website or ask at the school office.

Congratulations to our first Form Captains of the new school year... To enable pupils across the school to experience a taste of leadership and take responsibility we have 'Class Form Captains'!

Every class voted for two children to take this position of responsibility. Well done to our first group of Upton Form Captains

IMPORTANT YEAR 6 PARENTS MEETING: 'PESE' Meeting... We will be holding a 'PESE' Meeting (Procedure for Entry to Secondary Education) on Monday 15th September at 6pm. The meeting will be in the school hall. Parents with children in Year 6 are encouraged to attend the meeting, as the procedures for the smooth transition

to secondary school will be explained and your questions answered.

Prayer Space: Reflection Week...From the 22nd to 26th of September there will be a 'Prayer Reflection Space' at the school for the children, staff and parents to interact with. This is being set-up and run by Fegans and Queens Road Baptist Church.

Prayer Space' is a National Initiative which supports different aspects of the National Curriculum and Religious Education. It will also support the values of Upton Junior School. A marquee will be erected in the school grounds with various activities centred on the different aspects of Christian Prayer and will encourage children to think and reflect on their own lives and wider world issues in a calm environment. Everyone will be encouraged to use the space in a way that best suits them, whether that is through quiet reflection or through prayer. As the week progresses the character and appearance of the space will change as the children write and draw their own reflections and prayers.

The children will be visiting the prayer space during the school day but we want to make it available after school every day across this week (3pm - 3:45pm) and across the whole afternoon on Friday (26th), from 1.15 to 3.15pm, for parents to come and see what the children have been involved in and to interact with the space if you would like to.



Road Safety: The start and end of the school day are extremely busy times and we ask, for the safety of children and adults alike, that you follow the guidelines for dropping and

collecting your child. If you drive your child to school we have an allocated 'Drop-Off Zone' that we ask you to kindly use, otherwise, entrance on foot would preferably be through the gate opposite the playgrounds. Bikes and scooters need to be walked onto the school grounds. Thank you for your support with this as we fully appreciate that the traffic outside school (both vehicles and pedestrian) can make life pretty stressful.

If you do use the bottom pedestrian gate, please use the pathway leading the playground and not the carpark.

Please start the year as we mean to go on with regard to parking safely (not on zig zag lines) and showing respect for the residents of Edge End and neighbouring roads. Thank you for your cooperation with this extremely important matter.

Walking to and from School: Parents use their discretion when and if they allow their child to walk to and from school. If you allow your child to walk to school independently we ask you to complete a form at the school office so that the school knows that your

children have permission. The school will then be alerted of a possible problem if your child doesn't arrive at school for registration and a member of staff will call you at the start of the school day.
