Having the opportunity to meet with Maths and English teachers as well as the class teacher should enable you to build up a full picture of your child's learning, progress, behaviour and social skills. Obviously nobody knows your child like you do - but experience tells me, we certainly see different aspects of their personality at school. I hope you came away from the consultations feeling proud of your child - proud that they are developing their own personality and set of values that will help shape the adults they will become.

For the small percentage of parents that have yet to meet with teachers, please do so <u>before the end of this term</u>. As I stress time and again - a key factor in a child's success is the interest parents take in their education.
