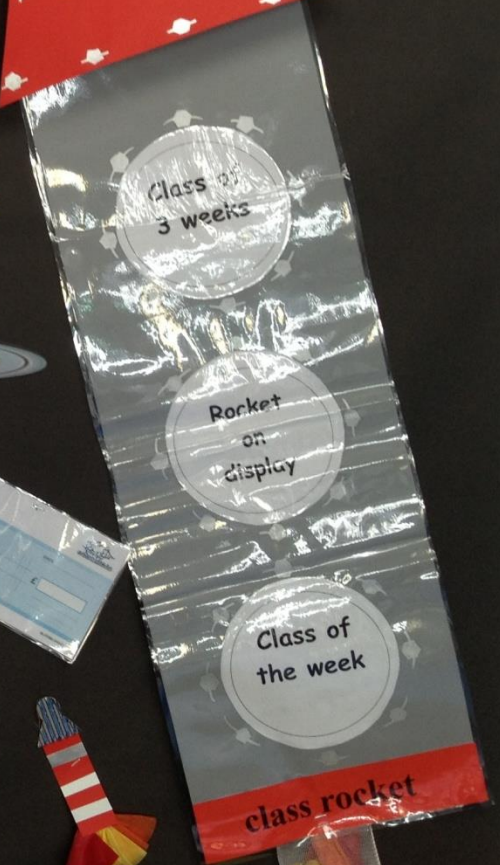
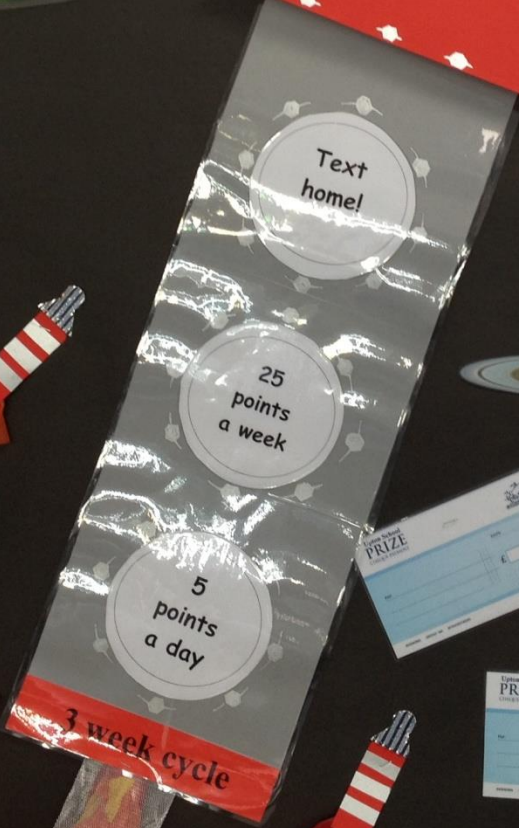
Poor Behaviour



We are here to learn. Behaviour for Learning helps us learn.

- Verbal warning – the teacher will warn the child that their behaviour is not appropriate classroom or playground behaviour.
- If they continue to misbehave – the child will be given a Yellow CARD. This means they will lose 1 of their behaviour points
- If they continue or the behaviour is thought to be more serious then they may receive a RED CARD. This means 2 points are taken off the total of 5.
- Cards can be redeemed during the lesson if a child makes an effort to change their behaviour.
- Cases of serious misbehaviour will be dealt with by the Year Leader of the Senior Leadership Team
