TOPICS FOR TERM 2

Invaders and Settlers

For term 2, Year 5 are going back in time - back to a period of **Invaders** and **Settlers**. In **History**, children will be investigating a period ranging from the fall of the Roman Empire in 400AD, through the invasions and settlements of the Saxons and Vikings, up to the eventual Norman conquest in 1066. In **Geography**, children will be investigating land-use changes during this period and evaluating evidence. In **Science**,



pupils will be looking at how the Vikings utilised wind resistance to aid in their invasions of these isles, whilst also investigating other scientific forces such as friction, water resistance and buoyancy. In Art, we'll be looking at and creating our own Viking jewellery and in DT we'll be building our own Viking longships! It's set to be an exciting and jam packed term!



ACROSS THE CURRICULUM



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Music - Term 2 5B and 5G

At Upton we teach the National curriculum for music through the focus of a different instrument each year.

Year 5 - Year 5 will learn to play the Ukulele.

For all lessons, instruments are provided by the school.

Computing - Term 2 5R and 5Y

Using Upton's own resources, the children develop their skills using a "flipped" teaching model. The children access resources, whether it is images, videos or written examples and learn what they need to know to complete the different milestones of the task. This unit builds on the previous unit in Year 4 using Scratch to build and edit algorithms for simple mazes and cat/mouse chase games. The unit is designed to help children develop their skills in writing their own algorithms as well as editing and debugging existing codes.

PE and Swimming

All Classes PE and Sport

PE takes place every **Monday**. Children will need to come in wearing their outdoor PE kits which they can stay in for the day. Tracksuits must be dark blue/black with no large logos.

5B and 5G will have Swimming in Term 2

Swimming: in <u>week 1</u> swimming will be on Tuesday, from week 2 onwards lessons will be on a **Wednesday**. Children will need to bring their swimming kit, swimming costume (full swimsuit for girls and fitted shorts for boys), swimming hat, goggles and towel in a bag. Please ensure all items are named.

Modern Foreign Languages

After a review of previous learning about of Chinese greetings and classroom language, the children will learn to ask and answer the question "Where do you live?", describe school bag objects and talk about food and drink. They are now starting to build sentences in Chinese using the correct structure.



ENGLISH


At Upton we believe that reading should truly be at the heart of the English curriculum. Through reading, pupils learn how to write and apply spelling, punctuation and grammar conventions.
