

Jane asked, “Is the band playing at the festival?”

Do not accept responses that do not logically match the given answer, eg:

- *Did you see where he went?*
- *How old is your dad?*

Do not accept the addition of a reporting clause which turns a question into a statement, eg:

- *“How old is he?” asked Rosie.*
- *Gurpreet asked, “How old is your son?”*
