TOPICS FOR TERM 1

MAGNIFICENT MOUNTAINS AND RAGING RIVERS

In this topic, pupils will learn all about mountains and rivers both in the UK and around the world. The start of our topic will show the children how the natural world can be protected and why being environmentally aware is important. During DT, the children will plan, make and review an environmentally friendly home, linking their learning of sustainability. In Science, pupils will have to opportunity to know the processes of the water cycle, understand evaporation and condensation and explore materials changing state. In History, pupils will learn about the lives of Edmund Hillary and Junko Tabei and the incredible journeys they took up Mount Everest. In Geography, pupils will how to



locate oceans and seas on a map and explain how rivers are formed through the water cycle. They will also explore how mountains are formed and how this links with rivers. Through Art, pupils will explore environmental and manmade patterns and use this to create their own patterns and to tessellate them. ACROSS THE CURRICULUM

Music - Term 1

Year 4 children will be learning the Violin this term.

Computing- Term 1

Presenting Digital Photographs.

This unit introduces children to two different software choices for a creative way of presenting digital photos. Using existing images, children spend three lessons learning skills in Microsoft Publisher and a further three lessons using Windows Movie Maker. In each case, the intended finished result is to present a 'photo story' using their still images. Lessons are designed to be used with Microsoft Publisher and Windows Movie Maker.

- PE and Swimming

All classes will have PE in Term 1

PE takes place every **Wednesday**. Children will need to come in wearing their outdoor PE kits which they can stay in for the day. A reminder that children can wear dark blue/black tracksuits (no large logos) as the weather turns colder.

Swimming: Lessons will be on a **Tuesday (children to come to school wearing uniform)**. Children will need to bring their swimming kit, swimming costume (full swimsuit for girls and fitted shorts for boys), swimming hat, goggles and towel in a bag. Please ensure all items are named.


ENGLISH


