At Upton we believe that reading should truly be at the heart of the English curriculum. Pupils who read well will ultimately have greater access to our textually rich world, generating a long-lasting love of books.

Text-based Curriculum

Our Text Based Curriculum means that all reading and writing will link to a class text. Spelling, punctuation and grammar (SPAG) will be explicitly taught and skills will be fed into the writing.

Children will be exposed to a range of authors and text types. In reading, children will be focusing on inference, understanding new vocabulary and using reciprocal reading skills (predicting, summarising, questioning and clarifying) to extend and deepen understanding.

In writing, children will be immersed in different genres and styles and taught the skills to do so. Writing tasks provide opportunities to build on these skills. Pupils will also edit, improve and publish their work.

MATHS

We follow the National Curriculum and the White Rose Schemes of Learning. Our lessons follow a structure including: Diagnostic questioning, let's link (teacher input), partner practice, main activities (differentiated tasks) and challenge activities. Pupils will also be exposed to varied fluency and reasoning/problem solving style questions, including the Build It – Draw It – Solve It strategy. This is to develop rounded mathematicians that can apply their knowledge to a variety of situations.

Pupils will also undertake frequent arithmetic activities, learn times tables (Times Tables Rockstars website, times tables songs and starters in lessons).

My Maths Times Tables Rock Stars

Within Maths teaching and learning, the Build it, Draw it, Solve it approach encourages the use of: Concrete; Pictorial; Abstract. The intention of such a progression is to develop the concept of 'Maths Mastery' in which all children fully grasps concepts before they are moved on within the curriculum.



MATHS

To develop your child's fluency and mental maths skills, we are introducing KIRFs (Key Instant Recall Facts) throughout school.

KIRFS are a way of helping your child to learn by heart, key facts and information which they need to have instant recall of. KIRFs are designed to support the development of mental maths skills that underpin much of the maths work in our school. They are particularly useful when calculating, adding, subtracting, multiplying or dividing.

They contain number facts such as number bonds and times tables that need constant practise and rehearsal, so children can recall them quickly and accurately.



Key Instant Recall Facts

Year 6 – Autumn Term I

By the end of this half term, children should know the following facts. The aim is for them to recall these facts with speed and accuracy:

I can count in powers of 10, forwards and backwards with numbers to 10 million

Children should be able to count forwards and backwards in powers of 10 (10, 100, 1,000, 10,000, 100,000) up to 10 million.

See examples below:

Count forwards in steps of 10, starting from 10,000:

10,000, 10,010, 10,020, 10,030, 10,040, 10,050, 10,060, etc.

<u>Top tips</u>

The secret to success is <u>practising</u> little and often. Use time wisely. Can you <u>practise</u> this KIRF whilst walking to school or during a car journey? You do not need to <u>practise</u> all aspects of the KIRF all at once; perhaps you could have a fact of the day, or a few facts per week to <u>practise</u>? If you would like more ideas, please speak to your child's teacher.

Practical resources and ideas


Focus on counting forwards and backwards where your child needs to cross a 10, 100, 1,000, 10,000 or 100,000.

For example, count backwards in steps of 100 from 4,100: 4,100, 4,000, 3,900

BEHAVIOUR

We are here to learn. Behaviour for Learning helps us learn.

•Verbal warning – the teacher will warn the child that their behaviour is not appropriate classroom.

• If they continue to misbehave – the child will be given a Yellow card. This means they will lose 1 of their behaviour points.

•If they continue or the behaviour is thought to be more serious then they may receive a RED CARD. This means 2 points are taken off the total of 5.

 Cards can be redeemed during the lesson if a child makes an effort to change their behaviour.

•At lunchtime we have cool down benches for children to have some time out.

•Cases of serious misbehaviour will be dealt with by the Year Leader or the Senior Leadership Team.



BEHAVIOUR

- Each day you will start with a maximum of 5 points.
- Between Monday and Friday you can earn a maximum of 25 points.
- If by Friday afternoon you have kept your 25 points then you will exchange these for PERFECT POINT FRIDAY!
- Points will also then be counted after 3 weeks and we will receive rockets.
- Points will be taken away for inappropriate behaviour during lessons.
- If children have lost a point they will lose 2 minute for every point they have lost from their perfect point time- this means no one misses the entire treat!
