#### **Swimming**

Swimming was able to take place last year upon COVID return and all children across the school had access to three sessions. Swimming also took place in every year group pre-COVID and so many children had reached the 25m mark in the lower school. The impact on our swimming data has been much lower than schools without pools.
