Write a diary / review about your trip to the Ramsgate Tunnels.	Write in role as a soldier to his family about life in the trenches.	Create a piece of artwork, or make a model 3D scene from the war.
Draw and label a great airplane from WW2 e.g. British Supermarine Spitfire. Alternatively, you could make a model.	Design a parachute for a soldier that would keep them safe.	Create a Glossary of World War 2 terminology, which could be used to support Year 6 children with their learning.
Write instructions or an advice leaflet for citizens to follow during an air raid.	Plan your own WW2 Dig for Victory garden. You could choose however you wish to present your garden. You may wish to use: <a href="#">Tinkercad - Create 3D digital designs with online CAD</a> Will you have fruits, vegetables? How will you organise your planters? Can you label them?	Write a non-chronological report on an aspect of war that interests you. You may wish to focus on the topic of: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Women at war;</li> <li>● Technology and weapons;</li> <li>● Medical care;</li> <li>● Childhood during the war.</li> </ul>
Create an optimistic light jar depicting a scene from WWII. On dark paper cut out a scene/image, glue it inside a jar/clear bottle and then pop a light inside to see a wonderful effect. 	Write a newspaper report to announce that war has ended in 1945. You should research some historical information to make your report authentic.	As part of your learning around WW2, listen to the famous wartime songs by Dame Vera Lynn: We'll Meet Again and White Cliffs of Dover. Write your own song of hope about the times we are living in now. It could be sung or rapped. But it must be a song of about hope and looking to the future.
