Make a model of a habitat for your favourite animal.	Sketch Broadstairs beach and label the key features of land use.	Create a poster to help people remember the 4 compass points. North, South, East and West.
Make a 3D model linking to Broadstairs. This could be a beach, the town, the parks, Upton.	Create a leaflet describing how to care for a pet or another animal. What does it eat? Where does it sleep? How does it exercise?	Draw and describe the life cycle of an animal of your choice.	Go on a bug hunt and keep a tally of what you find. Classify your discoveries into vertebrate and invertebrates.	Can you draw a map of your local area and use ordnance survey symbols to show physical and human features.
How many different habitats can you think of? Make a collage to show the different types.	Learn to spell these topic words: habitat, environment, hemisphere, equator, biome, adaptation, climate, polar. Write a sentence for each of the above spelling words.
