Design your own Anglo-Saxon village.

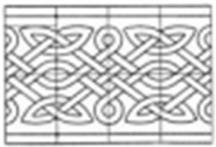
Write a biography about Alfred the Great, explaining why he was such a significant figure in Anglo-Saxon history.

Make an Anglo-Saxon longhouse using any materials you have at home. You may need to research their appearance/structure beforehand.

Use a map and see how many Anglo Saxon place names you can find. If they end -ton, -ham or -burgh what did it mean?

Make a board game about Anglo Saxon attacks.

The Anglo-Saxons were great craft workers. They made intricate jewellery and brooches with animal patterns. Find and copy your favourite Designs.



Do you feel it is fair to invade and settle in another country?

Create a magazine article/blog/podcast to express your point of view.

Prepare and cook traditional Anglo Saxon- foods such as mushroom soup, honey, oat and spice cakes or summer fruit, honey and hazelnut crumble. If you choose this, you must have adult supervision!

Create a time line to show when the Anglo Saxons were in Great Britain and any major battles or events that happened.

On a map of Britain, plot the route the Anglo-Saxons took from Stamford Bridge to Battle (Hastings).
